Consider Calvin's definition of Christian faith:



"Now we shall possess a right definition of faith if we call it a firm and certain knowledge of God's benevolence toward us, founded upon the truth of the freely given promise in Christ, both revealed to our minds and sealed upon our hearts through the Holy Spirit" (John Calvin, Calvin: Institutes of the Christian Religion, trans. from the 1559 Latin ed. by Ford Lewis Battles, 2 vols., in Library of Christian Classics, ed. John T. McNeill (Philadelphia: Westminster, 1960), Book III, Chapter 2, Section 7).

At some point I subscribed to "Theology Matters", an e-news publication, though I do not remember why or when or how. A Stated Meeting of the Session was held on July 14, 2021. Highlights include:

Zoom continues to allow worship by members and visitors who cannot come in person. We will also commemorate Veterans in November. (Probably on Nov. 7 before the 11th on Thursday.) Kay also noted that our next special service will be Polka Sunday with Mike Middleton and that date is set for October 17th.

Buildings & Grounds--The Committee will be requesting additional bids for repairing/ replacing the lighting in the building. Bruce Vineyard is completing work on the stained glass windows that have been rescued from the attic and have had the glass repaired.

Mission and Community Care--Robin is coordinating with representatives from the Mission agencies that we support to have them come and provide updates and information on what they are doing in our community. The first speaker scheduled to come and present minutes for mission is Natasha Roberts from Helping Hands.

a keeper. John Calvin wrote a two volume treatise, "The Institutes" as we seminarians abbreviated the tomes, on his understanding of the emergent Reformed Tradition. The definition of faith presented as "a firm and certain knowledge" is all encompassing of what we believe about God and how God moves towards us in benevolence." "God loves us" is a shorthand way to capture the elegant language of Calvin's Institutes. 2021 language and experiences must be increasingly relational as COVID moves us apart again. God NEVER moves away from us-believe this and cherish time in God's Presence even as the outside world rages in pandemic and pandemonium.

As we move forward in the coming months I am sure anxiety will cause us to socially distance, wear masks and avoid large crowds. Sometimes anxiety is nature's way of getting our attention to make us aware of real and present dangers. I have no predictors of how serious the virus threat will become or what measures for personal safety we will need to put in place, if any. I do know this is our word too, from Paul's Letter to the church at Rome:

²⁷And He who searches our hearts knows the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God. ²⁸And we know that God works all things together for the good of those who love Him, who are called according to His purpose. ²⁹For those God foreknew, He also predestined to be conformed to the image of His Son, so that He would be the firstborn among many brothers....

If You Are Sew Inclined


